

Luke 3:21-22 Why is Jesus baptised?

""Which one of you convicts Me of sin? If I speak truth, why do you not believe Me?" (John 8:46, NASB95)

"He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (2 Corinthians 5:21, NASB95)

- Perfect submission to the Father

"He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit," (Titus 3:5, NASB95)

## 2. Power for Victory

"Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led around by the Spirit in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by the devil ..." (Luke 4:1–2, NASB95)

- He is filled with the Spirit and led by the Spirit
- In the power of the Spirit He uses the Word of God to resist
- In the power of the Spirit he corrects the misuse of the Word of God



## 2. Power for Victory

"Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led around by the Spirit in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by the devil ..." (Luke 4:1–2, NASB95)

- Complete dependence on God for His physical needs
- Complete submission to God for fulfillment of who He should be
- Complete trust in God to fulfill what He has said



# 2. Power for Victory

"Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led around by the Spirit in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by the devil ..." (Luke 4:1–2, NASB95)

- I don't even need the devil to mess up do quite well on my own
- What chance do I stand against the enemy without the Spirit?
- What chance do I stand without Spirit led insight into the Word of God?



#### 3. Power for Service

#### Anointed to:

- Preach the gospel
- Proclaim release
- Set free the oppressed
- Proclaim God's favour
