


Ephesians 5:15-21

The book of Ephesians is structured like the book of Romans:

Chapters 1-3 - Done! – all that Christ accomplished

Chapters 4-6 – Do! – What it looks like to follow Jesus

"And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory." - Command to not do something
- or beer or hard liquor or drugs
- Get drunk = have enough that it fills you, controls you, to saturate, to drench



"Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. And

do not get drunk with wine,

for that is debauchery,

- ❖ Why? It leads to something
- Debauchery = behavior which shows lack of concern or thought for the consequences of an action—'senseless deeds, reckless deeds, recklessness.

"Who has woe? Who has sorrow? Who has strife? Who has complaints? Who has needless bruises? Who has bloodshot eyes? Those who linger over wine, who go to sample bowls of mixed wine. Do not gaze at wine when it is red, when it sparkles in the cup, when it goes down smoothly! In the end it bites like a snake and poisons like a viper." (Proverbs 23:29–32, NIV84)

Just substitute wine for Pot

- Filled = Generously supplied, complete, full, finished, satisfied
