- "He sent Eliakim the palace administrator... to the prophet Isaiah son of Amoz." (2 Kings 19:2, NIV84)



✓ "After all that Hezekiah had so faithfully done, Sennacherib king of Assyria came and invaded Judah. He laid siege to the fortified cities, thinking to conquer them for himself." (2 Chronicles 32:1, NIV84)



√ "King Hezekiah and the prophet Isaiah son of Amoz cried out in prayer to heaven about this." (2 Chronicles 32:20, NIV84)



- 1. Remember He was a man of God
- 2. He turned the leadership to God
 - A. He got the priests and Levites working 29:4
 - B. He assembled the princes and leaders 29:20
 - C. He set up worship leaders 29:25
- 3. He then gathered all the people 29:28
- 4. He then reached out to the remnant of the Northern Kingdom 30:1 call to repent!
- 5. Encouraged the leaders 30:22

""Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged because of the king of Assyria and the vast army with him, for there is a greater power with us than with him. With him is only the arm of flesh, but with us is the LORD our God to help us and to fight our battles." And the people gained confidence from what Hezekiah the king of Judah said." (2 **Chronicles 32:7–8, NIV84)**

"This is what Hezekiah did throughout Judah, doing what was good and right and faithful before the LORD his God. In everything that he undertook in the service of God's temple and in obedience to the law and the commands, he sought his God and worked wholeheartedly. And so he prospered." (2 Chronicles 31:20–21, NIV84)

- "... There was no one like him among all the kings of Judah, either before him or after him." (2 Kings 18:5, NIV84)







√ He struggled in his faith at times 2 Kings 18:14

"So Hezekiah king of Judah sent this message to the king of Assyria at Lachish: "I have done wrong. Withdraw from me, and I will pay whatever you demand of me." The king of Assyria exacted from Hezekiah king of Judah three hundred talents of silver and thirty talents of gold." (2 Kings 18:14, NIV84)

"But Hezekiah's heart was proud and he did not respond to the kindness shown him; therefore the LORD's wrath was on him and on Judah and Jerusalem." (2 Chronicles 32:25, NIV84)

- √ Jesus: Who do people say I am? Matt. 16:21
 - "You are the Christ = Messiah The King!
- ✓ Peter: God forbid you should go to the cross! V 22 = Appeal to pride and selfishness you are too important, too powerful, that is too low for you
- ✓ Jesus: Get behind me Satan You want man's will not God's v 23
