The spiritual gift of encouragement/exhortation.

 The special ability God gives to come alongside another person to give them courage to follow Jesus better.

- Parakaleo
 - Para (alongside)
 - Kaleo (called)



Example One: Barnabas (Acts 4:36)

- 1. Barnabas helped needy people.
 - Acts 4:36, 37
- 2. He sponsored an unpopular new believer.
 - Acts 9:26, 27
- 3. He encouraged new believers to remain true to the Lord.
 - Acts 11:22-24
- 4. He recruited a promising teacher.
 - Acts 11:25, 26



Example One: Barnabas (cont'd)

- 5. He developed a young, gifted assistant
 - Acts, chapter 13 and 14 (Barnabas and Saul Saul and Barnabas)
- 6. He restored a youth who had run away.
 - Acts 15:39
 - 2 Timothy 4:11
- 7. Weakness: He compromised biblical doctrine and practice.
 - Galatians 2:13



Four Meanings of Encourage/Parakaleo

- 1. Comfort the people who are hurting.
- 2. Exhort, admonish, gently correct those who are drifting.
- 3. Affirm those who are struggling.
- 4. Thank someone who is doing good.

Why?

 To promote spiritual growth in people, and help them have courage to follow Jesus better.
